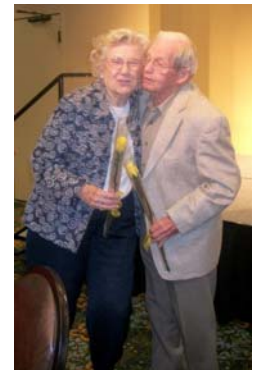
1st Quarter Mission Project

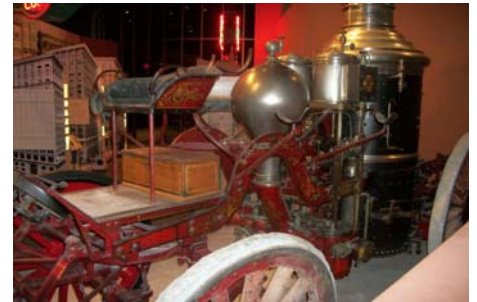
